Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) is the national program name. Your State may use a different name.

The checklist on this envelope can help you get ready for your interview with a SNAP eligibility worker. u do not need everything on this list. Collect only the checked items. Bring them with you to your SNAP interview.
